

Analysis

Oh was this match a close one in scores. As we can see with the stats team Finland had less unforced errors in total than their opponents but also a lot less winners. Either their shots were not powerful enough or team Akiq-Frankfurt had better defence. I think it's a combination of both. Also better play construction can lead to more winners so the quality of serves can derail the play from the beginning. The most interesting point about this confrontation is that the four players combined for a combined + 26 differential - so much more winners than unforced errors which is great for spectators.
